Keeping Your Pet Safe

Top 8 Common Household Poisons

- 1) Foods & Additives – like chocolate, raisins, grapes and xylitol (artificial sweetener often found in gum)
- 2) Human medications – like Tylenol, ibuprofen and antidepressants
- 3) Plants & trees – like lilies and poinsettia
- 4) Pest control and baits – like rat poison and slug bait
- 5) Flea and Tick Products – Do not apply dog products to cats and use weight appropriate doses
- 6) Lawn and garden herbicides and pesticides
- 7) Household cleaners and chemicals
- 8) Antifreeze and de-icers

Ways to protect your pets from toxins and poisons

- 1) Use products on pets wisely – don't use dog products on cats or vice versa and don't share prescriptions items between pets
- 2) Use only products designed for pets – don't use human medications on pets unless expressly directed by your veterinarian
- 3) Keep medications out of reach of pets
- 4) Wash pets feet if exposed to fertilizers, de-icers or antifreeze
- 5) Restrict use of pest control products
- 6) Clean up antifreeze, deicers immediately and keep out of reach of pets – these products are sweet and pets like to drink them
- 7) Check plants for toxicity and keep any toxic plants out of reach of your pets
- 8) Don't feed moldy foods or grapes, raisins, chocolate or any product sweetened with xylitol to pets
- 9) Keep trash cans secure
- 10) Call poison control, your local vet or your local emergency clinic if there is any possible toxin exposure immediately.
